C) SECTION C: READING COMPREHENSION (10 MARKS)				

Read the following passage carefully and answer the questions below it. Make sure you write complete and correct English sentences. Pay attention to spelling.

Global warning and climate change refer to an increase in average global temperatures. Natural events and human activities are believed to be contributing to an increase in average global temperatures. This is caused primarily by increase in "green house" gases such as CO2. CH4, N20, and CFCs. Climate change affects all regions around the world. Polar ice shields are melting and the sea is rising. In some regions extreme weather events and rainfall are becoming more common while others are experiencing more extreme heat waves and droughts. These impacts are expected to intensify in the coming decades. Global warming is projected to have a number of effects on the oceans. Ongoing effects include rising sea levels due to thermal expansion and melting of glaciers rapidly shift, habitats on land and in the sea are changing, making them inhospitable for some species, while letting others move in and take over. In some case, entire ecosystems are at risk of collapsing. The polar bear could disappear in the wild unless the global warming slows. Dependent on the sea ice, the animal uses it as a floating platform to catch prey. Experts believe that the Arctic sea ice is melting at a rate of 9% per decade, endangering the polar bear's habitat and existence.

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In the original Climate Change in Africa guidebook, it was noted that climate change threatens to reverse many of the development plans that African nations have made, and that is true for nations in Asia and the Pacific region as well. It poses threat to food and water security, to political and economic stability, to livelihoods and landscape. But it also creates opportunities for politicians, business leaders and communities in Asia and the Pacific to act in ways that bring benefits for all. It can create opportunities for new business models and innovations, new routes to sustainable development and new ways for ancient knowledge to have an impact at home and in the wider world. However, climate change is inherently unfair. The countries and communities that are most at risk from its impacts, and at least able to adapt are those that have contributed least to the problem. If poorer countries pursue economic growth by the same means from which industrialized nations have benefitted- such as by burning coal and clearing forests,-they will only add to the climate change problem. When the richer nations provide "climate finance" in the form of loans not grants, they are in effect making the poorer countries to pay to fix a problem the richer countries created. The moral and ethical aspects of climate change have promoted the aspects of "climate justice". Climate justice activists call for equitable distribution of resources to tackle climate change and for climate-vulnerable people to take part in making decisions about how the money is spent.
